Dear Church Family,

What does Jesus look like? We all have our mental images of the Saviour. Many of these images probably come from our childhood memories, perhaps of children's bibles and Sunday School lessons. There is a "standard portrait" of Jesus in many churches. As a history teacher, I want to point out that we have no photographs of Jesus. First Century Judean males would have most likely had long hair and facial hair (moustache and beard). Let me point out that Jesus would not have been a fashion model with "perfect" hair and attractive features. According to the prophecy about the Messiah in Isaiah 53:2-4:

He was always close to the Lord. He grew up like a young plant, like a root growing in dry ground. There was nothing special or impressive about the way he looked, nothing we could see that would cause us to like him. People made fun of him, and even his friends left him. He was a man who suffered a lot of pain and sickness. We treated him like someone of no importance, like someone people will not even look at but turn away from in disgust. The fact is, it was our suffering he took on himself; he bore our pain. But we thought that God was punishing him, that God was beating him for something he did.

Now don't get me wrong: oh how beautiful our Savior is! But His "beauty" is not in earthly terms. The beauty of Jesus is in Who He Is and the marvelous things that He has done for us (and continues to do). That radiance is eternal and glorious indeed.

In my benediction yesterday, I told you that I look forward to one day seeing my Savior face-to-face, but until then, let us "see Jesus" in each other. UMH Hymn 192, "There's A Spirit in the Air," shows us the moments when Jesus can truly be seen: "When believers break the bread, when a hungry child is fed" (verse 3) and When a stranger's not alone, where the homeless find a home" (verse 5). I will close with the refrain of an old Baptist hymn I love by B.B. McKinney: "Let others see Jesus in you, Let others see Jesus in you; Keep telling the story, be faithful and true. Let others see Jesus in you."

Although SC UMC Conference statics show that our attendance at Lee Road is among the top third of all churches in SC, it is clearly recognized that we need to grow our attendance. Our Church Council has established a special purpose Task Force to take a comprehensive look at all of our church activities from the lens of growth. This is expected to be a long term, multi-initiative which will look hard at what changes are needed to grow our attendance.

The first order of business for the Task Force will be seek feedback from our membership on a proposal to combine our traditional and contemporary services into a single blended service. We are seeking your feedback on 1) should we consolidate services yes or no, and 2) if so, what time should the service start and what do we want our blended service to look like to be attractive and meaningful for us and visitors.

No decisions have been made, or will be made, until we have the opportunity to get your feedback. This will be done by hosting multiple "focus group" sessions facilitated by members of our Task Force. A session will be held in the Bridge at 10:30 AM on November 16 and in the Social Hall on at 12 PM for members of the traditional service.

Please give prayerful consideration to this impactful proposal and plan to attend one of these sessions.



Congregations that approach financial stewardship from a biblical perspective do not view the money Christians give to their church merely as a way to pay its bills. Rather, such congregations see financial contributions as a way to help people grow spiritually in their relationship with God by supporting their church's mission and ministry with a percentage of their incomes.

Our congregation's finance committee has selected the *Consecration Sunday Stewardship Program* as a way to teach the biblical and spiritual principles of generous giving in our stewardship education emphasis this year.

Consecration Sunday is based on the biblical philosophy of the need of the giver to give for his or her own spiritual development, rather than on the need of the church to receive. Instead of treating people like members of a social club who should pay dues, we will treat people like followers of Jesus Christ who want to give unselfishly as an act of discipleship. Consecration Sunday encourages people toward proportionate and systematic giving in response to the question, "What percentage of my income is God calling me to give?"

During morning worship on Consecration Sunday, we are asking our attendees and members to make their financial commitments to our church's missionary, benevolent, and educational ministries in this community and around the world.

Every attendee and member who completes an *Estimate of Giving Card* does so voluntarily by attending morning worship on Consecration Sunday. We urge people to attend who feel strongly opposed to completing a card. The procedure is done in such a way that no one feels personal embarrassment if he or she chooses not to fill out a card.

We will do no home solicitation to ask people to complete cards. During morning worship our guest leader will conduct a brief period of instruction and inspiration, climaxed by members making their commitments as a confidential act of worship.

We will encourage participation in Consecration Sunday events through the Consecration Sunday team and governing board members. Since we will make no follow-up visits to ask people to complete their cards, we will make every effort to inform, inspire, and commit everyone to attend Consecration Sunday worship.
