Dear Church Family,

Today in my daily reading of the One Year Chronological Bible I started the Book of James. James is really a beautiful book. It makes some important distinctions about following Christ that the early Christian Church needed to hear and put into practice. And guess what? The church today 100% needs to hear these things as well. Many times we think of religion as a formal set of rules or worship practices, but our faith is *and should be* so much more! James 1:27 gives us what the Father expects:

Religion that God our Father accepts as pure and faultless is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself from being polluted by the world.

James delves deeply into how our faith should be expressed in actions and not just in words.

What good is it, my brothers and sisters, if someone claims to have faith but has no deeds? Can such faith save them? Suppose a brother or a sister is without clothes and daily food. If one of you says to them, "Go in peace; keep warm and well fed," but does nothing about their physical needs, what good is it? In the same way, faith by itself, if it is not accompanied by action, is dead. (James 2:14-17)

This verse is twisted by some into James saying that our works save us. No. That's not at all what he is saying. Faith in Christ alone saves us. James isn't arguing with that. He is saying that if we follow Jesus, we need to truly care for others (those whom Jesus called our "neighbor") with actions. Allow me to tweak a popular kids' song to say what I think James meant:

***If you're a Christian, and you know it
Then your actions oughta show it
If you're a Christian, and you know it
Do good deeds.***

Rev. John Wesley called these "works of mercy" (offering comfort to others, visiting the sick and prisoners, and working to change systems that hurt and victimize people). Pray to God to help you identify the ways that you can perform works of mercy.



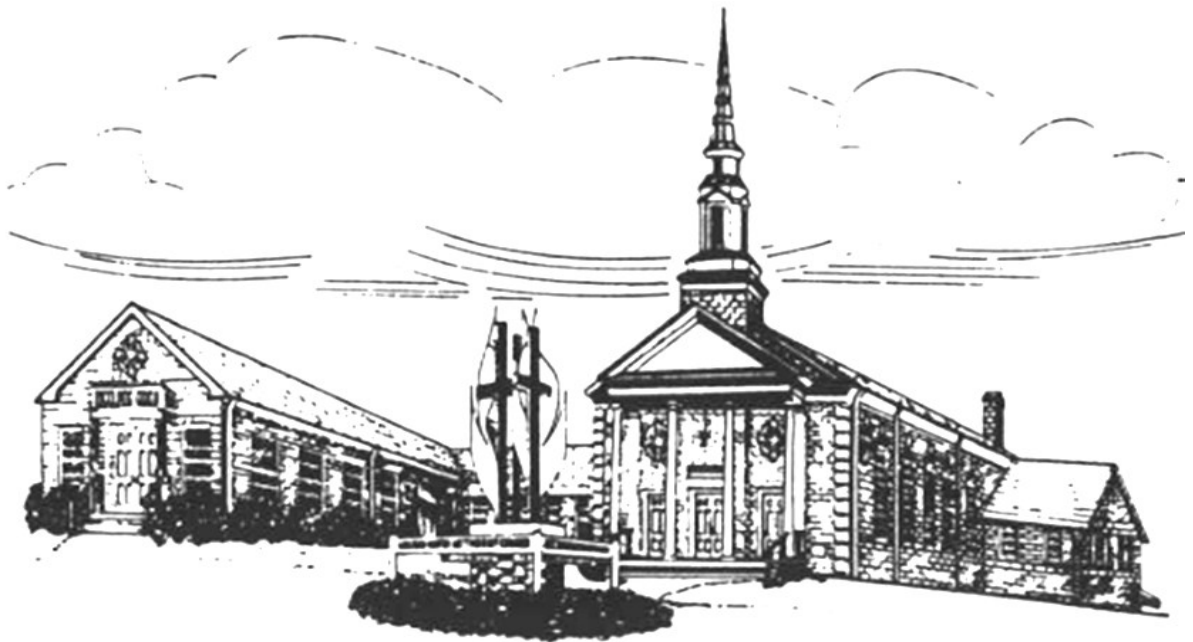
INTRODUCING THE NEW CAMPUS TEAM

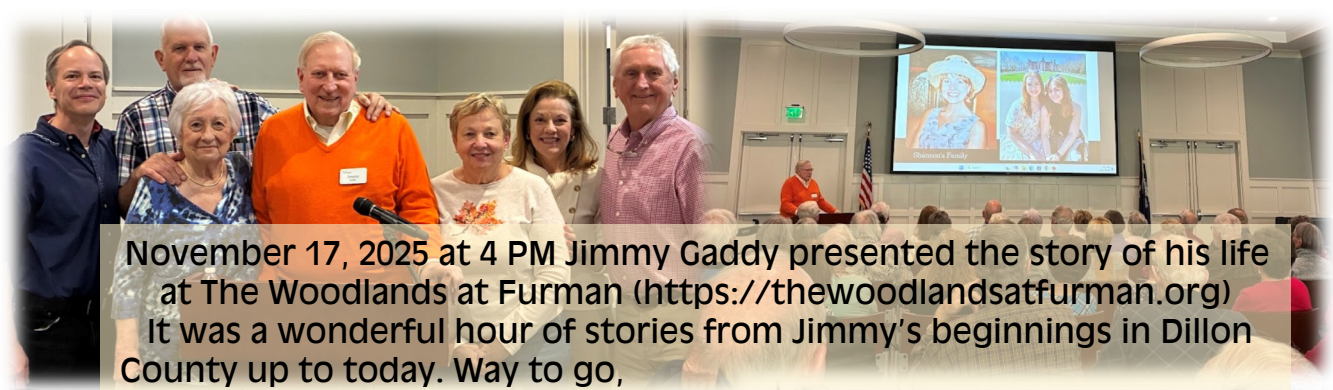
