Dear Congregation,

I'm reenlisting. That's right: I've signed up for another year. At what you say. Reading the Bible through in one year. I completed my goal last year with the *NIV One Year Chronological Bible*. This year, I am reading *The Narrated Bible* by F. LaGard Smith. Each daily portion contains little narrations/commentaries written by Smith that elucidate the background and "big picture" of the text.

Here's what I have discovered about reading the Bible through in a year:

- A. Don't get mad at yourself if you get behind. Just get caught up. The Devil will say something like, "See there, you've screwed up the goal. Might as well just give it up. Don't you have other things to do?" The answer to this is simple, "Get behind me, Satan."
- B. No matter how many times you have read the Bible, even a most familiar passage, you can discover something completely new if you approach the text with reverence and an eagerness for the Spirit to open the Word for you.
- C. The goal for the Christian should never be "to read it through in X amount of time" but rather "to read it as long as God gives me on this Earth."
- D. The Bible is a library with many different types of books (histories/genealogies, prophetic works, poetry/wisdom, law, epistles, gospels, etc.). It's okay to admit that you like certain categories of books more than others, but don't dismiss any of the 66 books – even the ones that are highly repetitive in nature ("and so-and-so begat so-and-so"). That said, there's a lot of lists of "begatting" in certain books (from Genesis up to Luke).
- E. If you've never tried to read a chronological bible before, pick one up and read it. It makes so much sense in that things are placed in the order that events occurred (to the extent that these things are known or discoverable). This gives you the "grand sweep" of biblical history of over 2,500 years.
- F. Thank God that you live in a free land where you can own and read God's Word.

May God bless your studies of His Word in 2026. It's not how much you read that counts. It's how much you open your hearts to what the Lord wants you to learn.






